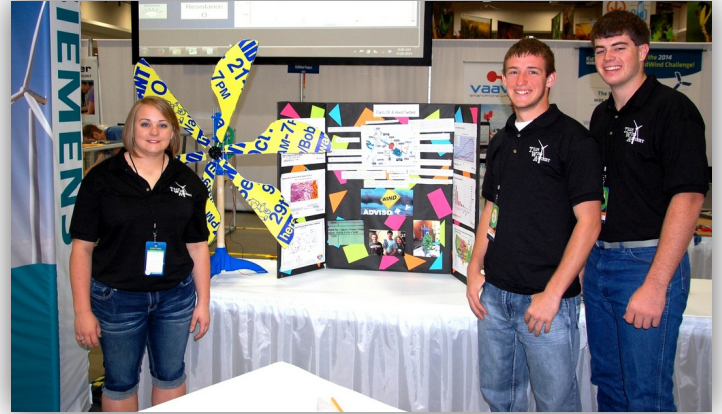

Sierra Club Environmental Grants for Kansas Primary and Secondary Educators

The Kansas Chapter of the Sierra Club offers a limited number of grants of up to \$1,000 to K-12 teachers who undertake projects, activities, and lessons to enhance student understanding of climate disruption and its impact.

Past grant recipients have used these funds to attend conferences, prepare special lessons and experiments, and purchase materials for lessons and projects on the climate crisis. Certified K-12 teachers in accredited Kansas schools in any field are eligible to apply.

We encourage applications from teachers across the academic spectrum, from liberal arts and humanities to science. We especially welcome and encourage applications from teachers in minority and indigenous communities.

Grant applications are typically available to download and submit beginning December 1st, with a deadline for submission on or near April 1st.
